Vision: To increase mental health awareness by partnering with youth and young adults with the goal of integrating youth voice into the statewide Children’s Behavioral Health System

Goal: To engage and connect with youth groups through-out the state in order to expose youth and young adults to the behavioral health system with the goal of linking local and regional youth groups to each other.
