State Invites Public Comment on Children's Mental Health Issues *Open Public Forums Will Be Held in May and June*

Hartford – As part of an effort to improve children's mental health services and systems, six open public forums are being held across Connecticut. The first open forum was held in March in Hartford and the remaining five open public forums will be held in May and June. The forums are designed as listening sessions. Feedback from the forums, along with input from written comments and other meetings, will be considered in the development of a statewide children's behavioral health plan.

At the end of the 2013 legislative session, the General Assembly passed Public Act 13-178, "An Act Concerning the Mental, Emotional and Behavioral Health of Youths," calling for DCF to produce a comprehensive children's behavioral health plan. DCF has contracted with the Child Health and Development Institute (CHDI) to help gather input and develop this plan. For more information, please visit www.plan4children.org.
