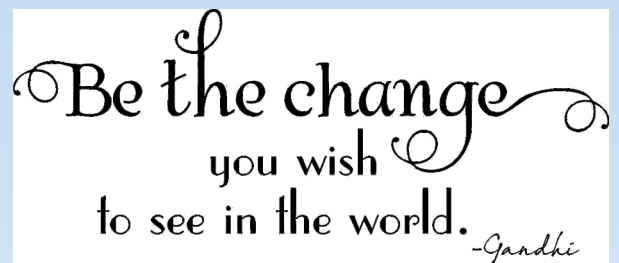

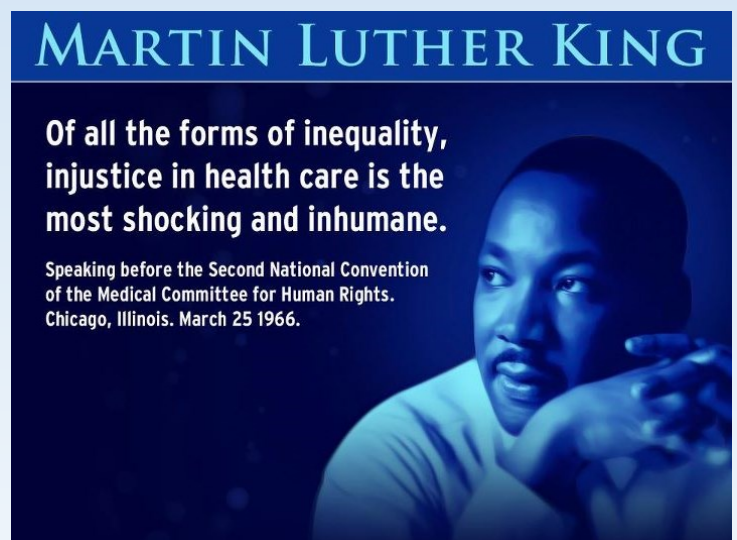
### Family Engagement Action Team (FEAT)

Family Engagement Action Teams (FEAT) are coordinated individuals and groups of parents, caregivers and youth dedicated to children's behavioral health system transformation. The goal of FEAT is to strengthen parent, caregiver and youth voice and to develop partnerships with local, regional and state decision-makers. FEAT members are referred to as Network of Care CHAMPIONS and are supported by the FAVOR Family System Managers, a CONNECT Family Engagement Coordinator, a CONNECT Youth Engagement Specialist and Beacon Health Options. ### Cultural and Linguistic Competency Development Team

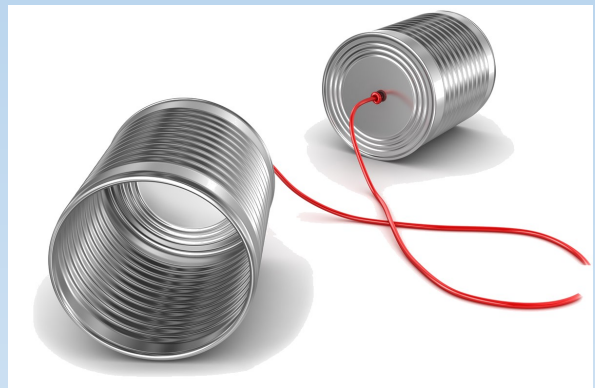


## CONNECT Statewide Transformation Teams

### Network Analysis Team

The reports from all four stakeholder groups (behavioral health providers, pediatric primary care providers, families and youth, and schools) have been finalized and distributed, but the work is not done! The Network Analysis workgroup has a busy six months ahead. Currently, a third round of community conversations is underway. The community conversations seek input from families and youth involved in the behavioral health system in CT. The conversations will occur from January to March of 2018. Starting in February, the second round of regional collaboration surveys will begin. Anonymous web-based survey links will be sent to designated behavioral health providers in every region. Results from this round of collaboration surveys will be compared to those obtained in 2016 in order to look at change overtime. 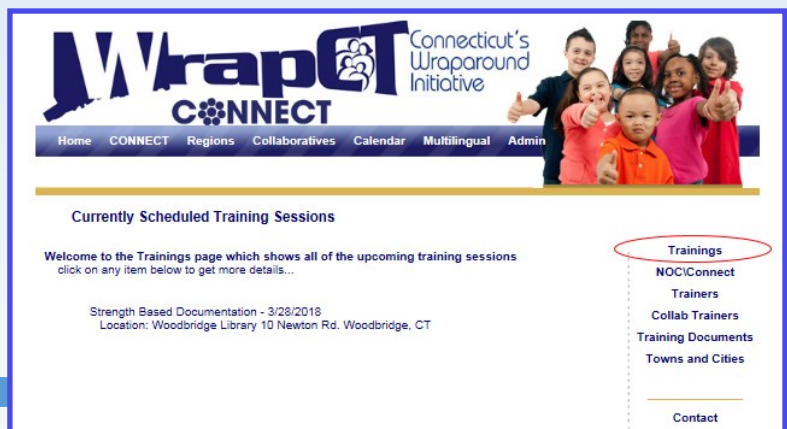

A special thank you to our family leader, Erin Dodge and her assistant, Melissa Smey. Erin is a wonderful photographer who donated her time to take pictures of all the children and their families with Santa so that they could remember this special day. Parents were so appreciative of this opportunity. One parent said "I have tried taking them to see Santa before but the environment was just too much for them. Thank you for giving us this opportunity. You let my children finally meet Santa."

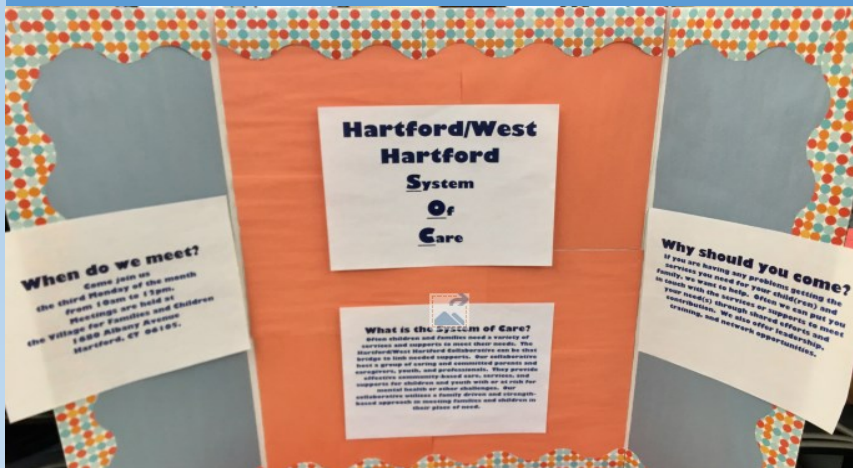

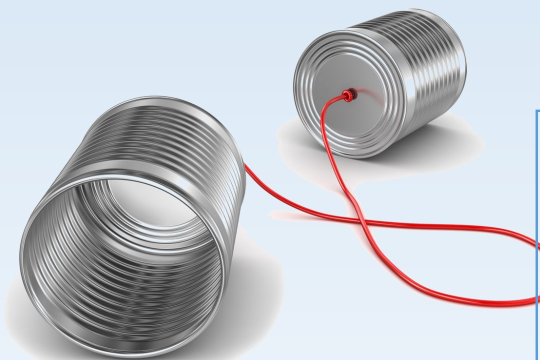
### Data Integration Team

Connecting Caring Communities, co-sponsored by the NCNC (North Central Network of Care) and the DCF Region 4 RAC, was held on June 13th in West Hartford, CT. In an effort to increase collaboration and share information and resources, this event featured a panel discussion by community-based providers that support children and families in the North Central region. Almost 90 people of various disciplines (behavioral health, juvenile justice, education, law enforcement, medical, faith based and caregivers and community members) attended to hear from the panelists and network with each other all in an effort to better serve children and families.

The panel included representation from Breaking the Cycle, Brothers Creating Opportunities, Compass Youth Collaborative, Ebony Horsewomen, Inc., Girls Empower Hour, Latin Enrichment Organization (L.E.O), and Young Educated Determined to Succeed, Inc. (Y.E.D.S). Panelists spoke passionately about their programs and the supports they offer to children and families. Which is everything from dance and drill teams, equine & animal therapy, cycling programs for teens with substance use disorders, leadership and mentoring programs, entrepreneur programs, support groups, and behavioral health counseling. Participants asked about barriers and program needs and one thing was clear; more funding and volunteers are needed. # Healthy From Day One



## Promoting Family Wellness

Health goes beyond visits to the doctor. While these visits are important for preventing and treating health conditions and diseases, they do not offer a full picture of health and wellness. It is important to focus on wellness within everyday life.

The Healthy From Day One public awareness campaign identifies the four pillars of family wellness as physical wellbeing, emotional wellbeing, relational health and access to community supports and resources. Shaped by a focus group consisting of parents and family members from New Haven, the language used was careful to reflect both the values and concerns of our families. The final product is universal in its application regardless of where you live in the state. Healthy From Day One is a messaging campaign from families for families.

The SHAPE System is part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration, Maternal and Child Health Bureau effort to expand and improve the quality of comprehensive school mental health systems in the United States.



#### ♦ Custom Reports

Self-assess your school mental health system's quality and sustainability based on national standardized performance measures just for school mental health. Each time your team works together to submit information on SHAPE, you will have access to free, customized reports reflecting your school's or district's data.

## CONNECT Statewide Transformation Team Updates

CONNECT Teams: Family Engagement Action Team, Cultural and Linguistic Competency Development Team, Communication & Social Marketing, Network Analysis, Data Integration, and Workforce Development.

### **Cultural and Linguistic Competency Development Team**

In July 2018, members from the CLAS workgroup presented a three-hour informational session titled, “Beyond the Basics of Health Equity: Implementing the National Standards for Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services” at The Institute for Innovation and Implementation Conference in Washington DC. They also exhibited a poster presentation, which was well received and obtained feedback about the great work going on in Connecticut.

Back in CT, the CLAS team held two accelerated “crash courses” for individuals and organizations interested in learning more about facilitating health equity planning and utilizing CLAS standards. In addition, regional Learning Communities were held in each of the six DCF regions. Learning communities are comprised of agencies that completed health equity plans and want further support and assistance, or those that are interested in learning more and participating in a sharing, supportive environment. Learning communities continue to meet quarterly in each region; please contact Lisa Palazzo if you would like to join one in your area.

A toolkit is currently being finalized which will provide assistance and information on how to utilize CLAS standards and develop Health Equity plans. More information to come.

Finally, in response to current immigration practices, a paper, entitled, “Supporting Immigrant Children and Families Following Traumatic Separations”, is being drafted to provide awareness, information, and resources for CT families. More to come on this important topic!

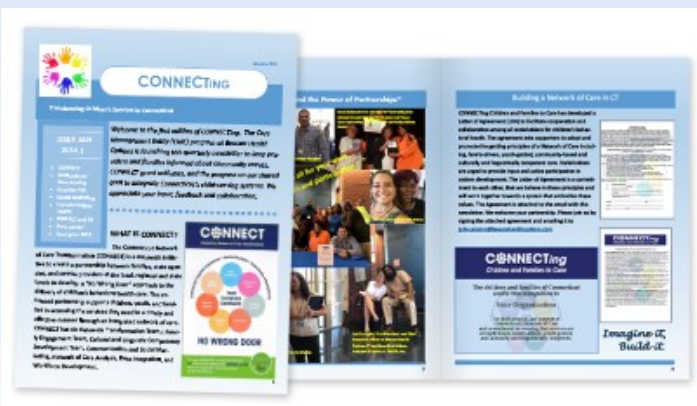
